Ivan's daughter Jane told us about the exceptional care Doreen received.

"Dad was struggling with looking after Mum, and I don't think the family were aware of just how bad it was getting. Then Mum went into the Royal Stoke Hospital for tests, and they discovered she had Lewy body dementia and Parkinson's. When she came out of hospital, Dad was determined to carry on looking after Mum, but it was quite exhausting.

"Mum needed 24/7 support. Dad was awake all night, and I was awake all day; then, we got referred to Katharine House Hospice through Mum's consultant.

"That was fabulous because, from that moment, we had the offer of night sits from the Hospice at Home team, and it meant we could actually stay awake in the day when we were needed."

"Hospice at Home helped a lot, but Mum started to go downhill and experience pain and anxiety and then started end of life treatment. A bed became available at the hospice, and we thought 'that's it.'

"But in fact, the care and support she received from the hospice's specialist teams meant she recovered enough to move into a local residential care home where we visit her regularly."

Tim and Dan grew up in Stafford with their mum, Doctor Bernadette Sharp, a Professor of Artificial Intelligence at Staffordshire University. Tim told us about the care his mum received and that his family continue to benefit from.

"Our incredible mum fell ill at the beginning of October. Then we received heart-breaking news, Mum had stage four cancer. We didn't know anything about it and had to learn what to do fast.

"Katharine House Hospice's reputation made introducing the charity to Mum reassuring, and she was keen to go. She wanted the peace, comfort and compassion offered and to be surrounded by her loved ones. "Mum started receiving palliative care at Stafford's County Hospital.
